

TOOTH ERUPTION: FROM NORMAL TO ABNORMAL FROM THEORY TO CLINICAL PRACTICE (Two parts)

Abstract

The course on teeth eruption patterns will cover normal and abnormal teeth eruption, clinical signs and differential diagnosis as well as possible treatment options throughout all dentition stages: from early mixed until permanent dentition. We will cover all aspects of most prevalent canine impactions – both palatal and labial as well as not that frequent but important eruption disturbances of first permanent molar, incisors and bicuspids. All problem-solving clinical settings will be covered from wait and see to the exposure and forced eruption from Mini screws. The course will be fully covered by clinical examples and real patients' stories.

Program Part 1

1. Normal tooth eruption: pattern, time and sequence according to body type.

2. Abnormal teeth eruption: clinical signs and symptoms. Making diagnosis right: normal delayed or abnormal impacted?

3. Guiding abnormal eruption from early mixed to late mixed dentition. When and how to intervene?

4. Labialy impacted canines: diagnostic and treatment objectives. Clinical management.

5. Palataly impacted canines: diagnostic and treatment objectives. Canine first approach or traditional archwire anchorage traction?
